

Interactive Exhibit Contest

What is an interactive exhibit?

- Attracts attention
- Focuses on a central idea
- Explains a concept; solves a problem; changes an opinion; teaches something
- Relates to your 4-H project in some way
- 4-H members will explain their exhibit in 1-2 minutes to a judge and answer questions



How do I prepare for my interactive exhibit?

1. Select a topic

Choose a topic that you know very well or relates to your project area. It does not have to be difficult, but does not need to be very simple.

2. Project should be self-explanatory.

Should not require step by step instructions. Exhibit should showcase knowledge gained, or a technique or skill learned.

3. Select visuals

Members will have half of a six-foot table. Free standing tri-fold boards should be used. Props should support the display board. Technology cannot replace your exhibit board, only use as a supplement.

4. Practice

Look at the audience. Speak clearly. Stand straight. Know your topic.

* Helpful Hints

The time limit is 1-2 minutes to explain and judges will have 2-3 minutes to ask questions.

Word 4-H or the emblem should be on the exhibit.

No live animals, babies, fireworks, weapons, or anything banned or prohibited at school.
